## KINGSWAY SOLAR COMMUNITY ACTION

It's been a busy month.

We've published a report on land use and solar energy, drawing on new modelling by Tony Day showing that large-scale solar offers limited grid benefits. We've promoted the #AskEd campaign with Stop Oversized Solar, challenging the government's renewable-energy strategy.

We issued an Open Letter to Ed Miliband in response to the government's claim that 76% of the public "wouldn't mind" living next to a solar farm. We also contacted George Freeman MP following the APPGSTA report *Feeding Britain Sustainably to 2050*, which warns that current land-use policies risk undermining UK food security.

We are continuing to encourage our MP to engage more fully with the inadequacies of the consultation process, which has left many residents feeling poorly informed.

During the consultation phase we strengthened our links with communities along the grid-connection corridor, and we are now working with BEAT (Burwell Energy Awareness Team) to help maintain pressure on these issues.

It has also been a busy month for wildlife, with sightings of golden plover and lapwings near the Fleam Dyke as winter migration gets underway. Please continue to log any wildlife observations on iRecord, particularly along the grid connection corridor. Every record counts.

We are working closely with the Parish Council Alliance who are seeking legal representation, which will be critical in the next stage. Our Crowd Justice fundraiser supports this effort. This ensures that donations only go towards a fully-funded case, with

automatic refunds if targets aren't met. Every pledge, large or small, helps.

Finally, a note on sign thefts. During the consultation it was wonderful to see so many signs, banners and stickers displayed. Unfortunately, after some early incidents, we've now had further reports of signs being taken. These are expensive to produce and funded entirely through your donations. If signs are removed from private land, please report it to the police and request an incident number. This helps us build a clearer picture of what's happening.

Wishing everyone a very Happy Christmas and thank you for your support throughout 2025.

### CAMBRIDGE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE BULLETIN

**Get your chimney swept and keep your home fire safe!**

The Service attends around 100 fires a year involving chimneys, most of which could be avoided by following some simple safety tips:

- Appoint a skilled and technically competent chimney engineer. To find your nearest local HETAS Approved Chimney Sweep visit: <https://www.hetas.co.uk/find-chimney-sweep/>
- Keep the flue shafts clear and ensure they are well maintained
- Only use properly treated wood to build a fire
- Always use a fireguard to protect against flying sparks from hot embers
- Make sure embers are properly put out before you go to bed.

We always advise getting your chimney swept at least once a year, preferably before lighting it for the first time when the cold weather arrives. There could be a buildup of debris that's accumulated over the year, which can be set alight when heating the home and could cause a significant fire.

Some will also be looking at using a chimney for the first time, that may not have been used for many years. It is really important to make sure it is swept and inspect the brickwork before lighting it for the first time.

### **Stay fire safe in your kitchen**

More than half the fires crews attend in the home start in the kitchen. This can be down to a number of things.

Below are some simple safety tips to help you stay fire safe in the kitchen:

- Avoid leaving children in the kitchen alone when cooking on the hob. Keep matches and saucepan handles out of their reach to keep them safe
- Take care if you're wearing loose clothing - this can easily catch fire
- Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob
- Double check the cooker is off when you've finished cooking
- Don't store items on top of hobs
- Take care if you need to leave the kitchen whilst cooking, take pans off the heat or turn them down to avoid risk
- Make sure saucepan handles don't stick out - so they don't get knocked off the stove
- Keep electrics (leads and appliances) away from water
- Check toasters are clean and placed away from curtains and kitchen rolls
- Keep the oven, hob and grill clean and in good working order. A build-up of fat and grease can ignite a fire.

### **Help your local community - become an on-call firefighter!**

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking to recruit more on-call firefighters to help local communities by responding to emergencies.

On-call firefighters are a vital part of your fire and rescue service. They respond to a wide range of incidents, from fighting fires and attending road traffic collisions to rescuing people and animals in need. They also respond to medical emergencies.

In addition to responding to emergency incidents, on-call firefighters support their communities by providing a range of safety advice helping people to keep safe in their homes.

Being an on-call firefighter has many benefits. As well as being paid an annual wage and for the time spent at incidents or training, there are also opportunities to develop first aid skills and heavy good vehicle driving qualifications.

## NEWS FROM LINTON VILLAGE COLLEGE

### **Battlefields and Bletchley Park**

School trips are an essential part of life at LVC, enriching our curriculum and offering experiences beyond the classroom. One of the most significant events in our calendar is the two-yearly Battlefields trip to Northern France and Belgium.

Led by the History Department, the trip takes 95 students from KS3 and KS4 on a journey through key sites of World War I. Starting in Ypres, students visit Essex Farm Cemetery and an Advanced Dressing Station, learning how medical care was delivered close to the front lines. At Mansel Copse and the Somme, they explore the realities of trench warfare and the

immense human cost of conflict. The Thiepval Memorial to the Missing and the moving Last Post ceremony deepen their understanding of remembrance and loss. Throughout the weekend, students develop historical

knowledge of why men fought, empathy for those who endured unimaginable hardship, and insight into the impact of war on individuals and societies.

Last month we also had over 100 students visiting Bletchley Park, the historic home of World War II codebreakers. Here, they watched a live demonstration of the Enigma Machine and took part in hands-on decoding activities, discovering how logic, mathematics, and teamwork were used to crack secret messages. The experience not only illuminated the vital role of codebreaking in the Allied victory but also highlighted its lasting influence on modern computing and cybersecurity.

Both trips offer students a unique opportunity to connect with history in a tangible way. These experiences remind us that the past is not just something we read about and that it shapes the world we live in today.

- Fenella, our Team Captain, led by example, securing 3rd place in the 40cm and then finishing 2nd in the 50cm.
- Rex showed true resilience after an unfortunate fall in the 40cm, bouncing back to achieve 5th place in the 50cm.

We are incredibly proud of our riders for their skill, sportsmanship, and team spirit. A huge thank you to Ryan Arnel, our team leader and organiser, for making this initiative possible.

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REPORT FROM CHARLOTTE CANE

As the year draws to a close and we gather for festive events across our villages and towns, I've been reflecting on what makes Ely and East Cambridgeshire so special — our sense of community, our compassion, and our determination to look out for one another. That spirit has shone through in everything from local campaigns to doorstep conversations this autumn.

In November, I joined my constituent Lisa Smart, from Cottenham, outside 10 Downing Street to deliver a petition with over 15,500 signatures calling on the Government to save vital hospice beds at Arthur Rank Hospice. Lisa's daughter received end-of-life care there, and her powerful story shows just how much this service means to families across Cambridgeshire. The petition is part of a joint campaign I launched alongside Liberal Democrat Cambridgeshire MPs Pippa Heylings and Ian Sollom to reverse an £829,000 funding cut. Without that funding, nine of the hospice's 23 beds face closure - meaning more than 200 patients could be left without access to specialist care each year. Everyone deserves compassion, dignity, and peace at the end of their lives. We must not let a funding failure take that away.

In Parliament, I've been urging the Government to deliver fair funding and real reform for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). In Ely and East Cambridgeshire, 4% of pupils have Education, Health and Care Plans — higher than the national average. Our schools do incredible work, but they need the Government's support. Every child deserves the chance to thrive, with properly funded and accessible support close to home.

I continue to press the Government on fuel poverty, after uncovering official figures showing that 9.6% of households in our constituency — that's 4,487 homes — were living in fuel poverty as far back as 2023. Shockingly, Ministers have yet to publish the data for the past year, even as families continue to struggle

with soaring energy costs. I am urging the Government to publish the latest figures, to end fuel poverty and tackle the cost-of-living crisis.

Whether it's meeting residents on the doorstep, attending local events, or holding my three monthly surgeries, I'm always here to listen and help. Since being elected, I've now closed over 9,000 cases where residents have come to me for advice or support.

As your local champion, I'm here to stand up for you - and I'll keep doing just that.

I want to extend my heartfelt thanks to everyone who keeps our community running through the darker months — from NHS staff and carers to utility workers, emergency services, and transport teams who work tirelessly through the holidays.

It is also a time when we need to look out for those in more need of support at every age and circumstance. Everyone deserves to be able to enjoy themselves and have some relief from the stresses of daily life throughout this winter season. #### **Support for young families**

For those needing support with young families, the County Council will again be operating its Christmas Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme. This will be in operation from 20<sup>th</sup> December to 4<sup>th</sup> January.

Children eligible for benefits-related free school meals can access a funded place at a HAF holiday scheme or family experience for up to 16 hours. Families experiencing financial hardship may also qualify.

#### **General support**

For those needing support over the winter, the links provided above will direct you to help for Cambridgeshire residents to stay safe, warm, and healthy throughout the colder months by sharing

practical advice, highlighting local support, and encouraging communities to look out for one another.

#### **LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION**

Though there is consensus the process and timelines we were forced into were not what any of us would have wished for, the County Council have voted to make sure the only option placing East Cambridgeshire with the City and South Cambridgeshire is put in front of government ministers at the end of November. Other councils will continue to work on and recommend their preferred options.

In addition, our local County and District Councillors have been working with parishes across Woodditton and Burwell to write a letter to ministers representing our unique position on this, helping to make sure our communities are linked to the likely Cambridge, rather than Peterborough based authority.

It will ultimately be the government that decides the future of our local government structures.

#### **HIGHWAYS**

##### **Improvements**

I am working with parish councils to consider improvements to our roads in the future. These not related to maintenance, but rather local schemes to improve the safety and practicality of our roads and pavements. Most parishes already have a good idea of the work needed from concerns shared by you or known to them. Please do continue to engage with either your parish councillors or myself if you believe there are things we should be considering for the future.

##### **Maintenance**

After considerable personal input to get interventions in place, by the time of reading, the road between the King's Head and Eagle Lane in Dullingham should have undergone work to make it safe. This work has been needed for a very long time and was critical ahead of general surfacing work scheduled for summer 2026, the existing road being the sub-layer for the regular stone treatment that has been seen recently on Station Road.

Also, the speed humps in Brinkley should now have progressed. The underlying pots holes having been filled and the humps being bolted back down to the surface.

The council's reporting site was upgraded in September,

I know many were frustrated by the system previously, but please do report any concerns on this site, it's the best way to inform officers of work to be done. An officer does now inspect our roads on a more regular basis, so over the coming year, you should notice improvements to any reactive maintenance work required.

Bottisham Ward

Local Government Reorganisation

The Leader of the Council is still pursuing Option B (with East Cambs joining Fenland, Huntingdonshire and Peterborough) for the Local Government Reorganisation. Cambs County Council has debated the options and plumped for Option A (with East Cambs joining Cambridge City and South Cambs).

The Full Council will have debated this on Thursday 20th November; the ECDC submission will be sent to the Minister of Housing, Communities and Local Government and Homelessness together with the submissions from the other Councils. This will be considered by the Minister, and a decision will be made soon.

Parish Councils in this ward have signed a letter to the Minister informing them of our desire to join with South Cambs and Cambridge City Council.

Street Sweeping

Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990, local authorities have a statutory duty to provide clean streets, footways and open spaces that are in public ownership. All towns and villages are divided up into "zones" with the busiest being cleaned more regularly. <https://eastcambs.gov.uk/waste-and-recycling/clean-streets>

East Cambridgeshire Community Fund

The East Cambridgeshire Community Fund will be open to applications between 31 October and 12 December 2025. Community groups are being encouraged to apply for grants of up to £1,000 to spend on new or existing projects designed to improve the quality of life for residents. ##### **Highways**

Further to my report last month, the repairs to the B1061 on the hill coming out of Dullingham should have been done by the time that you read this report.

However, this is not a full resurfacing but patching of the road to make it safer.

This is exactly what I told residents after the Highways Committee meeting in March 2025, with full

resurfacing taking place in financial year 2026/2027, so unfortunately this work was not expedited as an urgent matter by the Lib Dem controlled County Council, despite my pleading to officers.

I will continue to hold the administration to account. If there is any work that you believe requires work, please contact me and I will raise this with Highways and aim to get it done to address the neglect that has happened over the last 5 years.

#### **Council Reorganisation**

The work on Local Government reorganisation continues and will continue well into next year.

The Lib Dem controlled County Council has voted for Option A, The financial details show that combining with Cambridge will result in a loss of over £50m in funding compared to Option B, for the new unitary.

By the time that you read this, all the Councils in Peterborough and Cambridgeshire will have made their decision. I will provide a comprehensive report next month of the situation, what this means and next steps.

#### **Kingsway Solar**

The statutory consultation ended on 29<sup>th</sup> October, so we await the next stage during next year when Kingsway will present their further plans.

I have always maintained that we need better ways of generating solar power, making it compulsory on all new builds, on factory and business plants and sites like Babraham Road Park and Ride, where the solar panels are placed over parking spaces. That is a great use of the space.

Building on Grade 2 agricultural land is not the answer, as it risks our food security and creates more carbon in importing products from overseas. Buy British produce from the supermarkets or go to Farm shops and get good quality food that has many less air miles. I will keep you updated on this unnecessary development close to our community.

As this is the last report before Christmas, may I take this opportunity of wishing everyone a Happy Christmas and Merry New Year with your friends and family.

Look out for others not just at this time, but throughout the year and if you have any concerns about someone let the proper authorities know or if you cannot find the right people to contact, then let me know and I will do it for you.

Stay safe and I will speak to you all next year.

I have not done surgeries previously, because I am able to visit residents or meet them, wherever is suitable for them, rather than making residents come to me. I am available to all.
